ACCRA is a consortium of CARE International, OXFAM, Save the Children and World Vision and therefore ACCRA coordinates and works with consortium members in all her interventions. There are other government ministries and departments who are co-opted which includes; Office of the Prime Minister, ULGA, PFCC, Climate Action Network (CAN) Uganda. The consortium has different areas of operations such as:

CARE International – Vulnerability assessments, Ecosystem based adaptation, weather forecast dissemination and use of indigenous knowledge, providing seeds, training, providing water for agriculture etc

World Vision Uganda – Promoting Farmer managed natural regeneration, vulnerability assessments, supporting meteorology with weather equipment as well as building the capacity of the community to collect weather data, food security interventions, advocacy and disaster response

Oxfam – Supporting districts to do disaster management strategies, food security, seasonal forecast dissemination, studies on climate change impacts, training, etc

Save the children- Disaster risk management, provision of water in dry places, schools in hard to reach areas etc
